I. Call to order at 6:33PM by President Jason Heller (Jason Heller)
II. Consent Agenda:
A. Approval of the November 8, 2018 Membership Meeting Minutes (as posted online). A motion was made by Tracy Woodson, seconded by Jason Hale to approve the minutes as posted. Motion carried.
III. SFA Monthly Financial Report (Pleshette Moore) The treasurer was unable to attend this evening's meeting. The President reported that there is $\$ 11241.65$ in the bank and that we are trending ahead of all expectations. A full report will be posted online and available at the next meeting.
IV. President's Report (Jason Heller)

- Thank you to everyone who supported the first Springer Cookie Walk (aka

Cookie-palooza). We had almost 50 bakers and many cash donations that made the event a success. The teachers were overwhelmed and so genuinely appreciative. Thank you especially to Amada DeCapula for organizing and both Amanda \& Kathy for shopping for the additional cookies.

- The regular monthly BSD Board Meetings were held on November 26th \& December 17th. For the most part it was all routine business. At the November meeting, two new school board members were sworn in to fill vacancies on the board until the next election in May, 2019 - myself as the representative to 'nominating district G', and Dr. Debbi Zarek as the representative to 'nominating district F'. At the December meeting the final renovation plan for Claymont Elementary School was approved. The next meeting is January 14th.
- There was a Board Workshop held on December 3rd focused on updates to the district / board policy manual which has become almost unusable due to its size. The school board has committed to work through the manual policy by policy this year to have it updated and in a user friendly format for both parents and staff.
- I attended the district Parent \& Citizen Advisory Committee meeting on December 10th at Mt. Pleasant Elementary School. As always, Springer had (by far) the largest representation at the meeting. Springer parent Adrienne Parker was appointed as co-chair of this committee by Dr. Holodick and Tannie Fenning was selected as Springer's delegate to the committee. Tannie is Springer's link to share information back and forth between the SFA, Springer Parents and the district committee. The PCAC is a policy-mandated committee consisting of parent representatives of each school in the district as well as interested community organizations who meet quarterly at a district level to discuss important educational topics and share information back and forth between families. Topics discussed at the last meeting included district finances and
educational legislative priorities. The next meeting is scheduled for February and is planned to be a legislative roundtable.
- Springer will be holding their 4th annual MLK Day of Service on Monday, January 21st and will again be collecting donation of food and clothing items, as well as books for donation to local charities from 8AM to Noon. Students are urged to volunteer!
- We will be hosting Springer Night at Chick-Fil-A next Tuesday, January 15th from 5-8PM at the Concord Mall. Just mention Springer at checkout and they will donate a portion of the sale back to us! Additional volunteers are needed that night as well.
- Springer's Orchestra concert will be held on Thursday., January 24th. We will be selling refreshments and Spirit Wear again.

There was a motion by Amanda DeCapua, seconded by Greg Xenakes for the SFA to front the funds required to purchase the supplies for these concessions with the final proceeds to split 50/50 with the robotics team.
