- The March meeting of the school board was held on Monday 3/18/19. There are a number of policy revisions/additions that were approved for a first reading and are now available for public comment. You can review them on the district website and provide feedback before the next meeting on April 15th
- The district has transitioned to a new system for managing meeting agendas, minutes, policies, etc. in conjunction with the new website. BoardDocs is accessible from the School Board section of the website and allows the public to easily find the information they are looking for!
- There is a Board Workshop this Monday, March 25th to discuss district programs and initiatives, as well as evaluate progress on deliverables and goals of the District Success Plan. This is a public meeting.
- The district-wide Parent & Citizens Advisory Meeting was held on 2/25. This well-attended meeting featured a legislative panel of State Senators and Representatives. Our own Adrienne Parker, co-chair of the committee, moderated a discussion with the representatives on important educational issues.
- Thank you those who volunteered to staff the concessions for the February 16th Robotics event, Fun Night on the 22nd and the musical all last weekend. For the first time for the musical, we partnered with the district SITE program to offer flower bouquets, balloons and chocolate bars for the performers. I think it was a huge hit! For those who are not aware, SITE stands for Skills for Independence, Transition, and Employment. The SITE program provides vocational training and opportunities for 18-21 year-old students with special needs who have completed the requirements for a high school diploma. Through in-house businesses and community internship placements the program helps these young adults develop skills and confidence to help them reach independence.
- We will be running concessions again at the huge robotics event this Saturday. There is a sign up genius posted to the Facebook page we need a lot of volunteers! Thank you to those who have already signed up to volunteer!

- The Brandywine Education Foundation is hosting a fundraising event at Ulysses on April 4 from 6-8 p.m. I have been invited to appear as a guest bartender that night! As of last year's scholarships, the foundation has given nearly \$30,000 in financial assistance for college bound seniors from Brandywine, Concord, and Mount Pleasant.
