V. President's Report (Jason Heller)

- School Board Updates - here is a synopsis of what the board worked on over the summer:
- The board retreat was held on July 10th at Rockford Park. Topics discussed included sharing lessons learned from the NSBA conference, a district Strengths/Weakness/Opportunities analysis, a long discussion regarding the future of early childhood services and programming in BSD and discussion of the restorative classroom pilot at BHS
- There was a lot of focus on the significant amount of summer construction and building update work. A full renovation of Claymont Elementary started, and every other building in the district received some updates including classroom updates, lighting and energy efficiency updates, the conversion of Darley Road back into a BSD school for K-1st grade Claymont students, the move of the Brandywine Community School to space at St. Helenas, ADA compliance updates at MPHS, the start of the Auditorium restoration project and classroom updates and Brandywine and so much more.
- Ralph Ackerman was re-elected President of the Board, and John Skrobot III re-elected VP.
- The update to the Board Policy Manual that we discussed last year continued with the final policy updates being approved last week.

**Immediately following the regular business meeting was our 'Roundtable with the Principle' where Dr. Woodson led a discussion on the dress code.**

Dr. Woodson passed out the following Dress Code Guidelines that are also posted on the Springer website. Multiple parents expressed concern over an excessive number of dress code violations so far this school year. Dr. Woodson assured everyone that going forward, the staff would adhere to the following guidelines and that if anyone has any concerns regarding the dress code going forward to please email him directly.

## Springer Middle School Dress Code:

1. All clothing must be neat, clean, and in a condition of good repair.
2. Clothing with inappropriate, suggestive or derogatory pictures or phrases may not be worn.
3. Clothing designed to be worn as undergarments may not be visible.
4. No headwear is to be worn in the building during the school day.
a. This includes but is not limited to hat, bandana, scarf, earmuffs, sunglasses, or any other head covering, including hoods.
b. Exception: Any headwear worn for religious beliefs with the appropriate documentation.
5. Shirts and blouses that leave the midriff bare are prohibited.
6. All shirts must have sleeves.
7. Heavy, bulky jackets, or overcoats, as determined by the administration, should be placed in lockers.
8. Shorts and skirts are to be respectable and modest in length.
9. Pants and shorts are to be worn at the waist and a belt is strongly recommended. Pajamas are prohibited.
10. Excessively tight clothing is not permitted.
11. Clothing with frayed edges or visible holes is not permitted (unless there is a layer of clothing under the frayed item).
12. Appropriate footwear must be worn at all times (slippers are not permitted).
13. Students wearing jewelry or accessories that may be considered unsafe or inappropriate to the learning environment may be subject to review by the administration.
14. Any other garments or accessories that would be a distraction to the orderly educational process are prohibited.

Students in violation of the dress code policy will receive disciplinary action and will be excused from class until they are dress code compliant.

Dr. Woodson updated the group on a few additional topics based on questions/comments from parents:

1. Lockdown drills - there will be 3 or 4 this year. Teachers will explain each day this week what to do during a lockdown drill. Students will practice being quiet and off their cell phones for 20 minutes (b/c they are not to be on their cell phones during a real lockdown).
2. This week Springer is participating in "Start with Hello" Week (9/23-9/27). Start with Hello is the Sandy Hook Promise program that teaches students to make a difference with their peers in a simple, fun, and impactful way. They take small but powerful actions to promote connectedness and inclusion and to identify and help lonely students who are showing signs of social isolation.
3. Morning Announcements will always be updated on the Springer home page by 9 am each morning.
4. Students have been asked not to use mechanical pencils, as the lead inevitably falls on the floor and damages the floors. Custodians have been spending an inordinate amount of time trying to get the lead marks off the floors and have not been successful.
